




Day 1



The DX-ULTRA, a cordless ultrasonic irrigator operating at an impressive 43,000 Hz, presented a significant leap in cleaning efficiency with cavitation and negative pressure effects.



VATECH, renowned for pioneering the world's first 3-in-1 digital X-ray system and high-resolution, low-radiation CBCT devices, reaffirmed the industry's commitment to advanced diagnostics with minimal radiation exposure.

Finally, GENORAY, a trusted manufacturer of diagnostic computed tomography and limited-view field X-ray systems, continued to be a global favorite for its precision imaging capabilities.

On the second day of our exploration at the International Dental Show in Cologne, we approached with renewed enthusiasm and energy, knowing that there were still numerous halls and exciting innovations to discover.

WOODPECKERS ENDO RADAR PRO: Our journey began with the Woodpecker Endo Radar Pro, a newly upgraded endomotor from DTE's Woodpecker brand. This innovative device is designed to simplify root canal preparation, offering a seamless and safe method for dentists. Notably, it eliminates the need for two separate pieces of equipment, one for working length determination and another for biomechanical preparation. With its Two-in-One functionality and a compact handpiece, the Endo Radar Pro empowers dentists to shape root canals with precision while reducing the risk of procedural mishaps.

ORODEKA PLEX V Exclusive Thermal Process: The Orodeka Plex V NITI file stood out due to its exclusive thermal manufacturing process. This file undergoes metallurgic transitions, such as austenite and martensite phases, at room temperature, offering distinct advantages over other NITI files. Notably, it features controlled memory wire, respecting root canal anatomy, minimizing the risk of root weakening, ledges, and transportation of canal perforations. Additionally, its high resistance and flexibility make it a valuable tool for dentists. The ability to pre-curve the file enhances its efficiency, especially in curved canals.

DASK SINUS LIFT KIT: DASK introduced a solution for sinus lifts with their Crestal Approach Drills. These drills simplify the procedure by allowing precise measurements from the alveolar crest to the sinus floor through X-rays. Site preparation involves a sequence of twist drills, stopping just 1mm short of the sinus floor. Subsequently, DASK Drill #1 or #2 is employed to carefully approach the sinus floor with light apical pressure, reducing the risk of complications.

SEDAVIEW NASAL MASK: The Sedaview Nasal Mask employs a mask-in-mask design to minimize ambient nitrous oxide in the operatory. Its clear outer mask provides a visual indicator of "breathing through the nose" respiration by showing condensation. The soft inner mask ensures an improved facial seal, and its low profile expands the clinical field of view. This single-use mask minimizes cross-contamination, saves staff time, and engages patients with appealing colors and scents. It can also be used with other brands of scavenging circuits and is latex-free.

AER X (AEROSOL SUCTION): Aerosol generation during dental procedures, especially those involving high-speed equipment, presents infection transmission risks. The SycoTec AER X aerosol suction system addresses this concern by significantly reducing aerosol mists and spray mists. This is crucial in minimizing the risk of direct contact with potentially contaminated fluids and surfaces during surgical procedures. The AER X system plays a vital role in ensuring the safety of dental professionals and patients, particularly in the context of infections like COVID-19.

TEKMIL Wheelchair Platform with Correcta Dental Unit BIO ALIGNERS: TEKMIL presented a wheelchair platform featuring the Correcta Dental Unit BIO ALIGNERS. These aligners are biodegradable and can be transformed into compost, aligning with the growing focus on sustainability and eco-friendliness in dental care.

Location Of IDS Cologne

Koelnmesse GmbH, also known as the Cologne Trade Fair, is an internationally renowned trade fair and exhibition center situated in Cologne, North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany. This institution plays a pivotal role in the global trade fair landscape, hosting approximately 80 trade fairs and organizing over 2,000 conferences each year. Koelnmesse stands as one of Germany's largest trade fair organizers, and in terms of exhibition floor area, it ranks as the third largest in the country, boasting a sprawling 284,000 square meters.

The history of the Cologne Trade Fair dates back to its establishment in 1922. Initially, it was located in the historic Rheinhallen. However, in 2005, it underwent a significant transformation by relocating to modern premises adjacent to the original location. A notable architectural landmark within the fairground is the old Fair Tower Cologne, constructed in 1928. This iconic building features a tower restaurant on its top floor, offering panoramic views of the surrounding area.

In recent years, Koelnmesse has embarked on an ambitious and extensive renovation project, which commenced in 2018 and is slated to continue until 2030. This colossal endeavor comes with a price tag of €600 million. A significant portion of this investment is dedicated to the renovation of the seven southern halls, which date back to the 1970s. These renovations aim to modernize and enhance the facilities, ensuring that Koelnmesse remains a premier destination for trade fairs and exhibitions well into the future.

KOLN Calling: A Day Of Urban Discovery

Our expedition commenced with a visit to the renowned Cologne Cathedral, an awe-inspiring architectural masterpiece. To reach this iconic landmark, we crossed the Hohenzollern Bridge, spanning the majestic Rhine River. The Cologne Cathedral, known as "Kölner Dom" in German, holds a special place in the heart of North Rhine-Westphalia and the Catholic Church. It serves as both the seat of the Archbishop of Cologne and the administrative center of the Archdiocese of Cologne. This cathedral stands as a symbol of German Catholicism and an outstanding example of Gothic architecture. In recognition of its historical and architectural significance, the Cologne Cathedral earned the prestigious designation of a World Heritage Site in 1996.



Our visit to this magnificent cathedral was a profound experience, allowing us to immerse ourselves in its rich history, remarkable architecture, and spiritual significance. The Cologne Cathedral truly stands as a testament to human ingenuity and devotion, welcoming visitors from across the globe to admire its beauty and grandeur.



An enduring appeal, the Cologne Cathedral holds the distinction of being Germany's most visited landmark, drawing an average of 20,000 visitors every day. Its sheer grandeur is best appreciated through its soaring height, reaching an impressive 157 meters (515 feet). Notably, it boasts the title of the tallest twin- spired church globally, the second tallest church in Europe, surpassed only by Ulm Minster, and ranks as the third tallest church worldwide.



The Hohenzollern Bridge

The Hohenzollern Bridge in Cologne holds a special place, particularly for those in love. It has become a symbolic destination for romantics, both tourists and local residents, who wish to immortalize their affection through love locks on the bridge. These locks, adorned with personal touches, are attached to the bridge's grating as a symbol of everlasting love and loyalty. The ritual involves tossing the corresponding key into the flowing waters of the Rhine. As a result of this tradition, thousands of individually decorated love locks now adorn the Hohenzollern Bridge, each representing a unique love story.



In the post-war period, one of the two railway bridges was reconstructed and reopened in 1948. Additional enhancements occurred between 1956 and 1959, and again from 1986 to 1987 when two more truss arches were added. Today, the Hohenzollern Bridge stands as a six- track railway bridge, offering walkways and cycle paths on both sides. It remains a beloved symbol of love and resilience, connecting the hearts of those who visit and pass by it.

Constructed between 1907 and 1911, the Hohenzollern Bridge originally consisted of three adjacent truss arch bridges, each featuring three arches. One segment of the bridge was designated for road and tram traffic, while the other two accommodated railway tracks. Remarkably, during the Second World War, this bridge was the only one in Cologne to survive the devastating bombings unscathed. However, on March 6, 1945, in an effort to impede the Allies' advance across the Rhine, the Wehrmacht deliberately demolished the bridge.




The Rhine River

Eventually, it makes its way into the Netherlands, where it concludes its remarkable journey by emptying into the vast expanse of the North Sea.






